NOTE:

Once again, due to the unique nature of the committee, participants are allowed to use personal pronouns rather than formal delegation possessive pronouns (e.g., “My delegation,” “Your delegation”) when addressing fellow participants. Rather than referring to other participants as “Delegates,” in this committee, they will be referred to as “Principals and Officers.”

I. COMMITTEE BACKGROUND

The Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile, most commonly referred to by its acronym FiA, is a worldwide governing body that oversees and regulates several motorsport events,



such as the Formula 1 and World Rally Championships. The FiA is headquartered in Paris, France, and was founded in 1904 to promote safety, sustainability, and fairness in motorsports.

Formula 1, overseen by the FiA, is one of if not the most important and popular motorsport worldwide, it is a prestigious racing event that consists of several races or 'Grand Prix' hosted by different countries mostly from March through December.

- Red Bull - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Max Verstappen

2nd Driver: Sergio Perez

History: Oracle Red Bull Racing, also known as Red Bull Racing or RBR, is one of two F1 teams owned by Red Bull GmbH, the other being Scuderia AlphaTauri. This team has been managed by *Christian Horner* since it was first formed in 2005. The technical officer is *Pierre Wache*.



- Mercedes-AMG - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Lewis Hamilton

2nd Driver: George Russell

History: The Mercedes-AMG Petronas F1 Team, from the Mercedes-Benz Group, has been involved in F1 as an engine and team owner manufacturer since 1954. This team has been managed by *Toto Wolff* since 2022. The technical officer is *Mike Elliott*.



- Scuderia Ferrari - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Charles Leclerc

2nd Driver: Carlos Sainz



History: Scuderia Ferrari is the oldest and most successful Formula One team, having competed since the very first season of this event. Ferrari as a constructor has a record of 16 constructor championships and holds the most Driver's championships with 15 won by 9 different drivers. This team has been managed by team principal *Frédéric Vasseur* since 2023. The technical officer is *Enrico Cardile*.

- McLaren - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Lando Norris

2nd Driver: Oscar Piastri

History: McLaren is the second oldest active team and the second most successful F1 team, having won 183 races, 12 Driver's championships, and 8 Constructors Championships. The team has been managed by *Andrea Stella* since 2023. The technical officer is *Rob Marshall*.



- Haas - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Kevin Magnussen

2nd Driver: Nico Hülkenberg



History: Haas F1 Team is a racing team that first entered the F1 World in 2016. It became the first American F1 team after the "US F1 Team's" failed attempt in 2010. The team is now managed by *Ayao Komatsu*, and the technical officer is *Simone Resta*.

- Alfa Romeo - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Valtteri Bottas

2nd Driver: Guanyu Zhou

History: Alfa Romeo is an Italian racing team that has achieved 10 wins from 131 Grand Prix they have been present in, while also taking two wins as an engine supplier. The team has been managed by *Alessandro Alunni Bravi* since 2023, and the technical officer is *James Key*.



- Aston Martin - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Lance Stroll

2nd Driver: Fernando Alonso

History: Aston Martin began as a rebranding of the Racing Point F1 Team. The team's ownership, led by *Lawrence Stroll*, established Aston Martin as a major player in the Formula 1 grid. The technical officer is *Andrew Green*.

2nd Driver: Esteban Ocon

History: BWT Alpine F1 Team now competes with this name, replacing Renault. The team is managed by *Bruno Famin*, and the technical officer is *Matt Harman*.



- Williams Racing - Team Principal, Technical Officer



1st Driver: Alex Albon

2nd Driver: Logan Sargeant

History: Williams Grand Prix Engineering is one of the most successful teams in the history of Formula 1. Founded by Sir Frank Williams and Patrick Head in 1977, Williams has won multiple driver's and constructors' championships. Some of the greatest names in F1 history, such as Ayrton Senna and Alain Prost, have driven for Williams. However, the team has faced challenges in recent years, including changes in ownership and a decline in on-track performance. The team is managed by *James Vowles*, and the technical officer is *Pat Fry*.

- Alpha Tauri - Team Principal, Technical Officer

1st Driver: Yuki Tsunoda

2nd Driver: Daniel Ricciardo

History: Alpha Tauri, formerly known as Scuderia Toro Rosso, is the sister team to Red Bull Racing.

The team made its debut in 2006 after Red Bull purchased the Minardi team. The team aims to develop young talent within the Red Bull driver development program. Over the years, it has produced successful drivers who have later been promoted to Red Bull Racing. The team is managed by *Laurent Mekies*, and the technical officer is *Jody Egginton*.
